

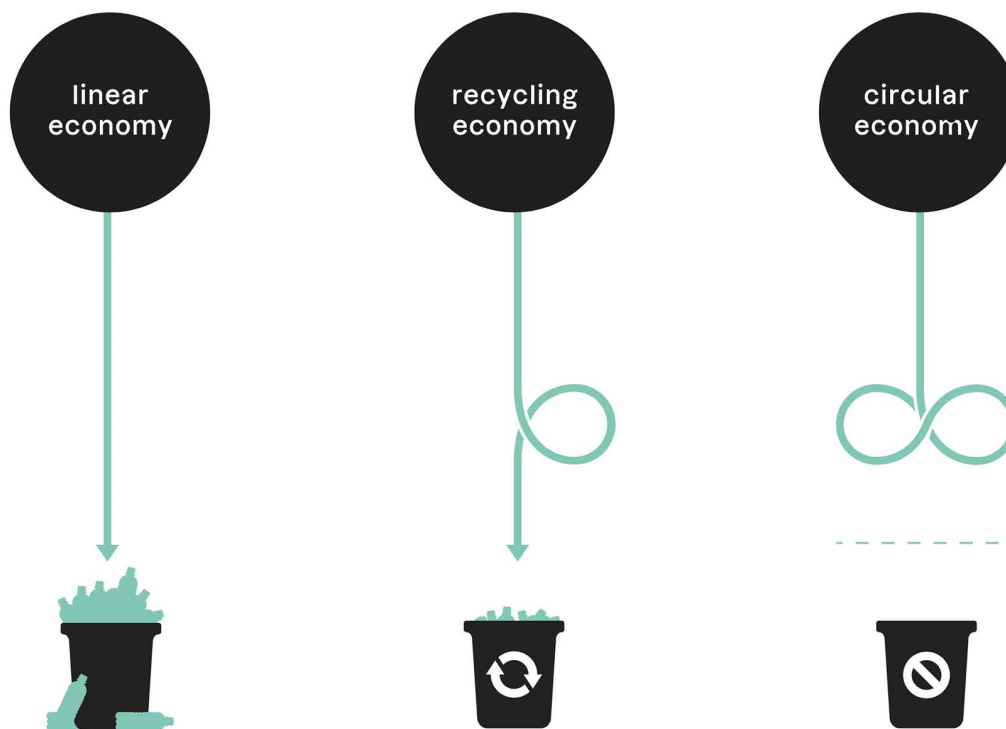
Circular Economy Working Group Seeking Expressions of Interest
