## PREVIOUSLY FUNDED PROJECTS

- FermenTasmania was awarded \$7.5 million through the Building Better Regions Fund Round 5 and has received \$3.4 million election commitment from the Labor party.
- The UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy was awarded in November 2021 and received \$150,000 of seed funding from the federal growth centre, Food Innovation Australia LTD (FIAL). The NTDC continues to advocate for funding for this project to deliver its four-year strategic plan (as above).
